Thank you for your December 16 letter received electronically today requesting approval to use Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons (RRFB) on a blanket basis at uncontrolled pedestrian and school crosswalk locations statewide in New Jersey, including State highways and all local jurisdictions' roadways. Your request is made under the provisions of Section 1A.10 of the 2003 edition of the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices and our Interim Approval memorandum IA-11 dated July 16.

Your request is approved. Please develop and periodically update a list of all locations where RRFB are installed in New Jersey. Local jurisdictions in New Jersey who install RRFBs under this Interim Approval should inform your office of such installations so you can maintain a comprehensive list of locations. Your specific approval has been numbered IA-11-13 "RRFB – New Jersey statewide." Please reference this number in any future correspondence.
