**LOCAL STUDENT WINS SECOND PLACE IN NATIONAL
“ROADWAY WORK ZONE” POSTER CONTEST**

Fredericksburg, Va. – Second-grader Grace Li of Crossroads Middle School (North Campus) has won a \$100 second place prize for participating in the “Life Behind the Cones and Barrels – How Roadway Workers Keep America Moving” poster contest.

The poster contest is facilitated by the Foundation of the American Traffic Safety Services Association (ATSSA), an international roadway safety association, headquartered in Fredericksburg, Va. The contest was created to help educate young people about work zone safety before they begin to drive. The contest challenges participants to draw their impressions of roadway work zones.
