If the public travels on property that you own or manage, your traffic signs, pavement markings, and other traffic control devices are now required to conform to the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices. Effective January 16, 2007, the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) amended the United State Code (U.S.C.) to clarify the applicability of the MUTCD to ANY privately owned property where the public travels. Examples are shopping centers, office and apartment complexes, and even recreation facilities.

Additionally, on December 21, 2007, the Department of Transportation, Federal Highway Administration issued Final Regulations governing Maintenance of Traffic Sign Retroreflectivity. This Final Rule is far reaching in effect and applies to most regulatory, warning, street name, and both ground-mounted and overhead guide signs – whether permanent, temporary or portable – on all public roads and private property where the public is invited to travel.

This webinar will help you understand the implications and risk associated with these laws, and what to do to keep your customers safe while traveling on your property. You will get an overview of each law from FHWA. You'll hear how a State Highway Administration has incorporated the law and worked with a local private property owner to ensure compliance.
