

# ATSSA Logo Use & Style Guide

The American Traffic Safety Services Association (ATSSA) unveiled its modernized logo in 2023. Guidelines for using the logo are included below.

The official ATSSA logo is four-color (navy, teal, orange cone with white stripes), with the “Safer Roads Save Lives” tagline. A simplified logo is also available when the image needs to be very small. ATSSA members may request to use the logo promoting their current, valid membership via a request form submitted to the Marcom Department. Ideally, the logo will be used on a white background for maximum impact and clarity.

The logo will have a minimum of 1x-width blank space around it. To maintain legibility, the minimum width of the main logo is 1.25 inch or 90 pixels. The minimum width of the simplified logo is 0.75 inch or 50 pixels.



## Color Variations for Logo Usage

ATSSA’s preferred color usage is the four-color logo (pictured below, top left), then the three-color blue + orange + white (cone stripes) or two-color white + orange option, then the one-color black or white if absolutely necessary.



Main logo version. 4-color.  
Blue + Teal + Orange + White.



2-color reversed version. White + Orange.



3-color version. Blue + Orange + White.



2-color version. Blue + Orange.



The black version of the logo should be used in grayscale prints over light backgrounds.



The white version should be used over dark backgrounds where the orange will not be visible and in 1 color prints.

*These color variations apply to the simplified logo as well.*

### Incorrect Use of Logo

When resizing the logo, make sure to maintain original proportions, do not alter them in any way. Generally, do not add a shadow or other effect such as bevel or emboss, unless it is needed for legibility or specific project creation. Avoid placing the logo on a busy, patterned background.
