

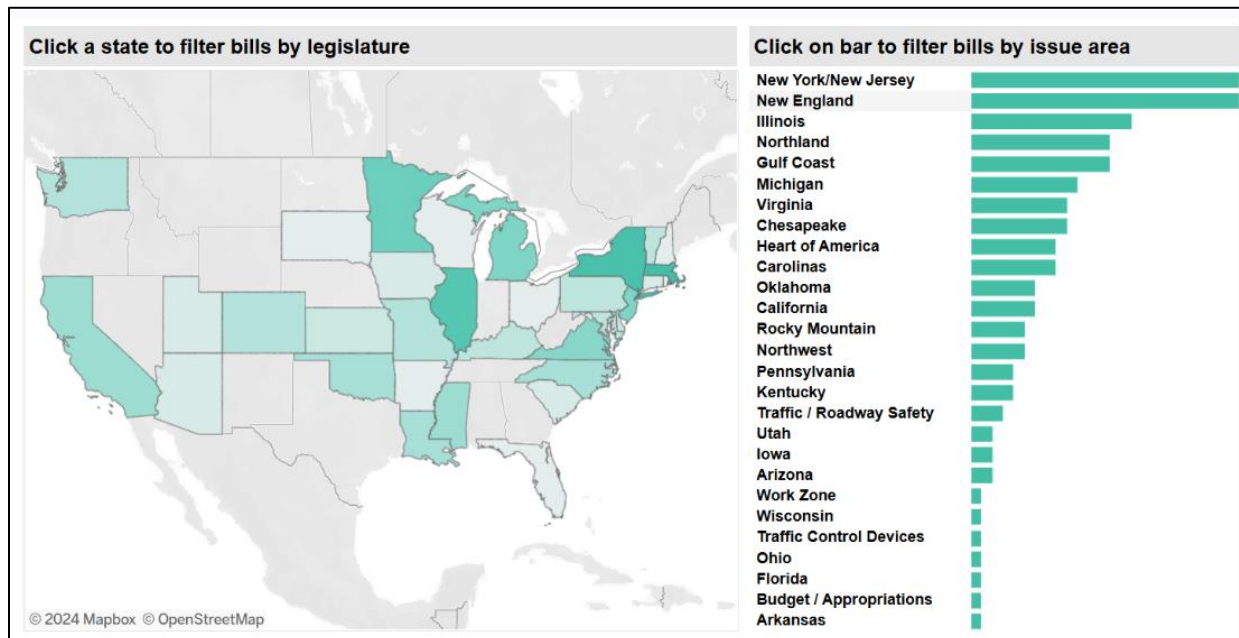
As part of ATSSA's Government Relations program, ATSSA's State Government Relations team tracks bills and legislation being introduced across the country that impact the roadway safety infrastructure industry. The [state policy map](#) sorts this information by state and issue area allowing ATSSA members to stay informed about the latest policy changes and trends both in their state and across the country.

### Key Features

1. **Interactive Maps:** The map interface allows users to visually explore policy developments across different states and issue areas. You can click on specific areas to get detailed information.
2. **Search by State or Issue:** Members can filter legislation by state, allowing them to stay up-to-date on legislation affecting their chapter, or by issue area, to see what states are working on similar legislation.
3. **Daily Updates:** The map updates every morning, ensuring members have the most current information.
4. **User-Friendly Interface:** The intuitive design makes it easy to navigate and find relevant information quickly.


### How to Navigate the Policy Map

1. **Filtering Data:** Use the filter bar and map to narrow down the data based on specific states or issue areas.



2. **Find Relevant Bills:** Once you filter the information, scroll down to see a list of relevant bills for your chapter or issue area.

Description

Photo speed monitoring devices; location. Authorizes the governing body of any county, city, or town to provide by ordinance for the placement and operation of photo speed monitoring devices in any location deemed necessary by the locality for the purposes of recording violations resulting from the operation of a vehicle in excess of the speed limit. The bill provides the same requirements for such devices, information collected from such devices, and any enforcement actions resulting from information collected from such devices as current law applies to the use of such devices in school crossing zones and highway work zones. The bill requires that two signs, rather than one, be placed warning of such device if the device is placed somewhere other than a school crossing zone or highway work zone.
